

A Message from Father Martin

Holy Week and Easter at St. Andrew's, Ben Lomond

Palm Sunday / Sunday of the Passion - 10 am

We will begin outside, weather permitting, to remember Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem and then to process up the ramp into the church. (Those who prefer may be seated inside.) We will have a Dramatic Reading of the Passion, Sermon meditation, and Holy Communion.

Tuesday in Holy Week - 11 am-12 Noon

A special Bible Study of the 4 Easter stories in the Bible. Invite friends for this review. (No Bible Study on the Tuesday after Easter. On April 11 we will continue our reading of Luke's Gospel.)

Wednesday in Holy Week - 5:30 pm

Lenten Soup Supper and Conversation about Ministry (how we are ALL ministers!)

Maundy Thursday - 7 pm

Worship service remembering Jesus' last Supper with his friends. Opportunity for foot-washing. Service ends with the dramatic 'Stripping of the Altar' remembering

Jesus' arrest.

Good Friday – two services at St. Andrew's

12 Noon – Community Good Friday Service, co-sponsored by five SLV churches: Boulder Creek Methodist, Felton Presbyterian, Mount Cross Lutheran Camp, Redwood Christian center (Assembly of God), and St. Andrew's.

7 pm – Good Friday service from the Book of Common Prayer

Easter Sunday - 10 am

Festive Easter Celebration with special music, baptisms, sermon and Communion, and an Easter Egg Hunt following the service. Bring a flower to decorate a cross on the front porch. (Plastic eggs with candy inside may be brought to the church ahead of time.)

ENGLISH TRIFLE

1 pound cake (use a thawed Sara Lee Pound Cake or make your own and cool it)

2 cups prepared vanilla pudding (don't use instant pudding)

1 cup whipping cream

1/4 cup sugar (or less)

1/4 cup slivered almonds

1 - 16 oz. package thawed frozen raspberries (or other berries, if you prefer)

A little sherry (to taste)

Slice cake and arrange ½ of the pieces in a glass salad bowl – bottom and sides. Spread ½ of the berries over the cake. Add a little sherry. Spread with ½ of the pudding. Repeat these layers. Whip the cream, adding the sugar. Spread on top of trifle. Sprinkle with almonds. Chill.


