

UNTOSSED SALAD

In a large salad bowl, place a layer of stemmed raw spinach. Press down. Sprinkle with salt, pepper and sugar (sparingly). Crumble 1/4 pound of crisp bacon over it. Add a layer of sliced hard boiled eggs. Cover with a layer of butter (or other leaf) lettuce. Add more salt, pepper, and sugar (sparingly). Add a layer of thawed, frozen peas. Add a layer of thin sliced onion.



Mix 1 pint of mayonnaise with ½ pint of sour cream. Spread over salad to cover. Garnish with strips of Swiss cheese. Refrigerate until serving time.
